The University's graduate school conducts a broad array of programs leading to master's degrees and increasing opportunities for doctoral education. UNC Charlotte is committed to equality of opportunity. To further racial integration, the University actively seeks to recruit and enroll a greater number of black students.

History

Established as Charlotte Center of the University of North Carolina in 1946. Became Charlotte College, a two-year community college, in 1949 and a four-year, state-supported college in 1963. Merged into the University of North Carolina in 1965.

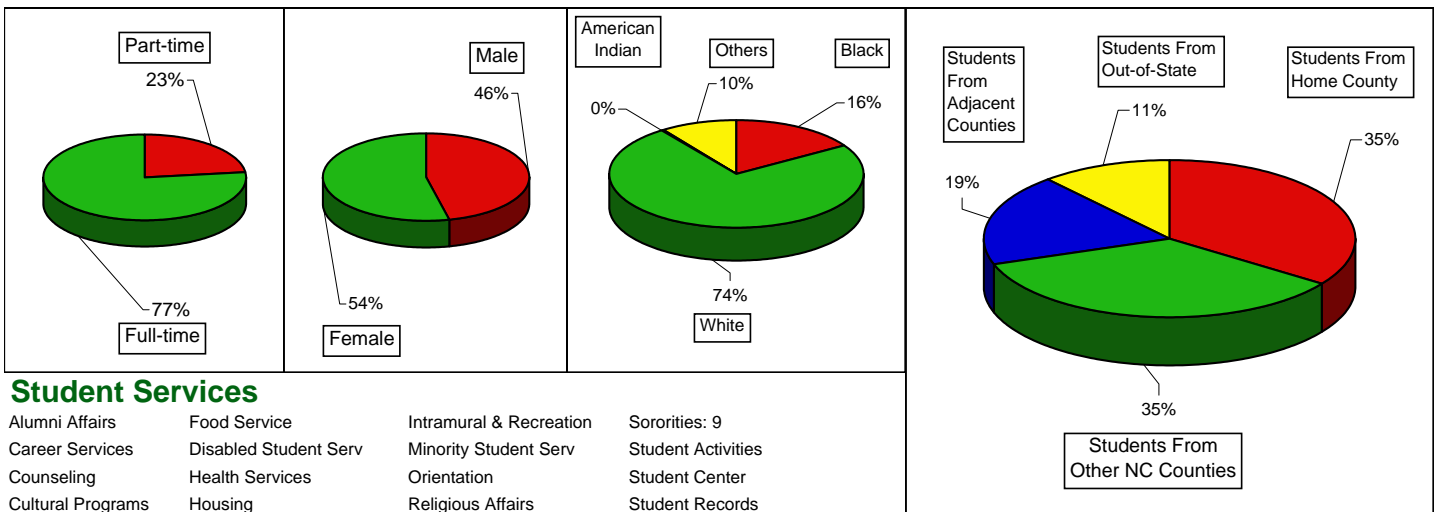
Location

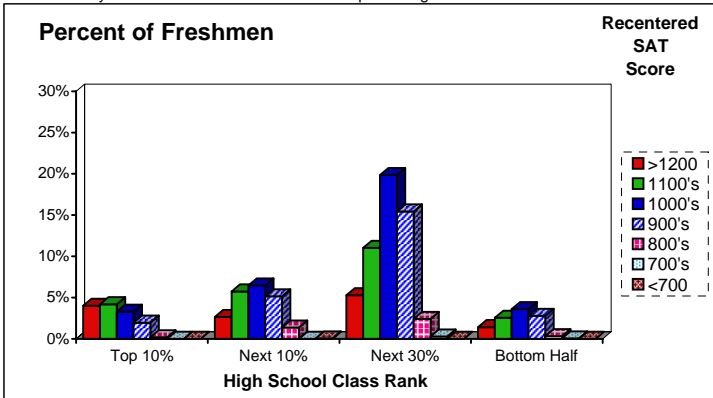
